Fredericksburg Rockhounds Meeting Minutes

- March 2nd, 2020 -

President Frank Rowell opened the meeting at 7 pm. Sara Verstuyft led the Pledge of Allegiance. Then Frank told a joke.

New members Bernice and Randy Snyder of Boerne were attending their first meeting. Guests at the meeting were Al and Judy Hargraves of Ingram; Mack and Paula Brice of Helotes; and Ashley and daughter Delila Odom of Stonewall.

Vice President Joe DeHoyos introduced a presentation by Lee Adams of a DVD about gemstones, "Treasures of the Earth." It explained the effects of the earth's heat and pressure in the formation of gemstones – diamonds forming deep below the earth's surface and coming up with volcano eruptions; sapphires forming in subduction zones; and emeralds resulting from the action of tectonic plates. The importance of math and physics in the faceting of gemstones was explained.

Right after the program member Ed Gage showed the effects of fluorescent light on several specimens. An emerald glowed scarlet red. Industrial diamonds glowed blue and bright yellow. A white garnet glowed a pink/orange color.

After refreshments and door prize drawings, President Frank Rowell started the business portion of the meeting.

Jim Gedeon reported that the silent auction proceeds at the January show were the best ever. We handed out 2700 door prize tickets, a substantial increase over last year. The Pioneer Pavilion space is already reserved for the 2021 show. Creating rack cards to advertise the show for multiple years was discussed. The club could save money this way. Visitors could plan ahead for the next years' shows.

Members discussed donating to a small college geology department. Ed Gage will check out Same Houston State University as a possibility. Donating to a museum or to preservation of a mammoth site was suggested. Since schoolteachers often foot the bill for supplies and equipment, another member suggested donating funds for geology-related equipment and supplies to secondary schools. Supplying application forms to teachers or science departments at schools was recommended as a way of finding out what a teacher or school might need and what the cost would be. The applications would help us judge the best recipients of our donations.

Lee Adams announced upcoming shows in other towns and cities. Frank Rowell announced the Llano Earth Arts Festival and international rock stacking competition in Llano.

If you want to donate a door prize, go to Lee Adams' table at the meeting and fill out the slip asking for your name and the name of the item donated and where it came from. 

The club will no longer mail out hard copies of the newsletter to members. Those who have provided the club with an email address will continue to receive notifications via email when the newsletter is published for viewing online.




