# Fredericksburg Rockhounds 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary

The hobby of rock hounding is so multi-faceted it has the interest of a wide span of people. As part of the Fredericksburg Rockhounds Club's  $50^{th}$  Anniversary, we are writing a series of biographies for some long time (not old) members. It is our hope you will see the diversity of people that are interested in rock hounding.

This month we feature Jeff & Brenda Smith (#articleb) and Tom & Sam Rogers (#snippetb).

#### Jeff & Brenda Smith

- A Biography -

Jeff was born in 1941 in New York City. His family lived on the East Side of Manhattan in Tudor City, purported to be the world's first residential skyscraper community. A nearby granite cliff provided Jeff an excellent view of the United Nations during its construction and opening ceremonies. He remembers sitting on his father's shoulders in front of St. Patrick's Cathedral watching the VJ Day parade. (He noticed rubber blocks used in the tanks' treads to prevent them from tearing up the streets.) By the time he was a first-grader, he was riding the city bus to school. Despite his bus-riding competence, his teachers complained that he would not "color inside the lines".

In 1950 Jeff's father, a broadcast engineer for WOR, decided to move the family to San Antonio and start a sound recording studio. By now the family included a younger brother and sister. They made the trip in a De Soto station wagon. At the end of that journey Jeff found a place very different from New York City. Over the next few years he paid less attention to school work. He worked at his father's recording studio and at the Handy Andy grocery store. "Coloring outside the lines" morphed into some interesting antics, including one that turned his high school's water supply a yucky green color. The principal told his family he could not return for his sophomore year. Schreiner Institute (now Schreiner University) was the military school that shaped him up and got him ready for college.

Jeff went to U. of Texas in Austin in 1959. He decided to major in mathematics because it is the language of science, and science had always interested him. After earning his B.A. and M.A. there, he followed the supervising professor for his Ph.D. to Texas Tech. Although there were some interesting consulting projects there, he was disenchanted with teaching and Lubbock. Before completing his doctorate, he went to work for Sun Oil in Dallas as a research mathematician. His boss in Dallas described Jeff's problem-solving approach as "thinking outside the box". (Is that the same as "coloring outside the lines"?) Jeff developed an interest in geochemical prospecting and a curiosity about how all aspects of the oil business worked. He asked to go to the Calgary office, where all facets of the business were in one place. The exploration manager in Calgary agreed to take him on, and they have become lifelong friends. Both he and Jeff eventually started their own businesses.

After selling his business, Jeff pursued a Ph.D. at S.M.U. He wanted to study geological sciences to understand the theoretical underpinnings of the work he had done in the oil industry. It took a while, but he earned the doctorate in geophysics in 1991.

Brenda was born in 1949 in the northwest part of Alabama along the Tennessee River. Going to town on the bus with her mother and two sisters was a grand adventure. Her parents grew up on farms in Alabama and became pen pals when her father was in the Navy during World War II. Brenda has happy childhood memories of picking strawberries and vegetables in her grandparent's gardens. Her family moved to Savannah, Georgia, in the 1950's, and then back to Alabama after a few years. As daughters of a Methodist minister, Brenda and her sisters were very well behaved. Brenda was not one to "color outside the lines".

Brenda started college at U. of North Alabama in 1967 and graduated from U. of Texas at Arlington in 1971 with a major in history and a minor in English. Looking in the Fort Worth Star Telegram classifieds, she found an ad for aptitude test administrator under "Male Help Wanted". Human Engineering Laboratory agreed to interview her if she passed some aptitude tests and promised not to quit before Christmas. She got the job. It involved timing examinees to see how quickly and accurately they performed scores of very specific types of tasks involving things like three-dimensional thinking, manual dexterity, and analytical thinking. It also involved explaining the results to clients and suggesting careers that fit their strengths. Two thirds of the clients were from Dallas. After repeated suggestions that the office relocate from Fort Wo Dallas were ignored, Brenda and two colleagues started their own aptitude testing nonprofit in Dallas. Brenda handle business side of things; one colleague handled the research work; and the other handled the public relations. Brenda w Privacy U. of Dallas evening courses and earned her MBA during this time.

Brenda and Jeff met in Dallas in November, 1977, and married in January, 1978. Jeff's interest in how geological structures came to be and his explanations so that Brenda can understand them have made their travels interesting. When they retired to Kerrville in 2002, John Dietrich and Bill Wildfong encouraged them to join the Fredericksburg Rockhounds. Jeff was Show Chairman for many years, and Brenda was President for a while. Jeff is interested in the electrostatic basis for dowsing and learned a lot from some of the old timers who are no longer with us. Brenda has likes field trips and collecting rocks for her garden. Both enjoy being with the Fredericksburg Rockhounds, a friendly and fun group of people.

# Sam (Buck) Rogers

- A Biography -

Sam Rodgers was born in 1949 in Guanajuato, Mexico and was raised in Mexico City.

He attended elementary school 1-6 grade in a public school in Mexico City and grades 7-9 in a Military Academy in Mexico City. Sam finished grades 9-12 college preparation and grades 13-16 college preparation in Mexico City.

In 1966 Sam's family evacuated from Mexico to El Paso, TX. Sam needed the necessary papers for school so he attended El Paso High School and joined the Navy in 1968.

While in the Navy, Sam served on the USS Essex, CV-9. The Essex was decommissioned in Boston in 1969. Sam was then transferred to Naples Italy for 3 years and served as a Naval Airman at that facility. When his enlistment was complete, Sam moved back to Mexico in 1972-1975 where he studied Anthropology at the University of the Americas.

Sam's mother stayed in the U.S. and worked at Washington State University in Pullman, WA. In 1975, she asked Sam to return to the U.S. to help her move to El Paso, TX. The two drove from Washington State to El Paso during a gas shortage. That same year, Sam's mother got a job at San Antonio Trinity University and asked Sam to drive her there. Sam liked San Antonio better that El Paso so he decided to stay.

Sam went to work as a chef in San Antonio at the Church House Dinner Theater for about a year while attending San Antonio College using his GI Bill. In 1979 Sam reenlisted in the Navy and was stationed in Pensacola, Florida. Sam met Mary Eileen (Pepper) in Pensacola and they were married. Sam and Mary have one son.

Mary Eileen (Pepper) is a graduate of the University of Texas San Antonio School of Nursing. Pepper has a master's degree from the University in California nursing Administration. She was born in the Naval Hospital in Key West, Florida.

The Navy transferred Sam from Florida to Norfolk, Virginia where he worked for 3 ½ years. When his enlistment was complete he got out of the Navy and went into business in the Tidewater area. His business was American Hygienic, a cleaning business and he also worked for a car wash firm as an engineer.

In 1989, Pepper got a job in Richmond, VA where they lived until 1994. In 1994 Sam and Mary moved back to San Artonio where Sam took over a bakery. He then became a night manager/baker for a popular San Antonio restaurant until in a in 2007. Pepper worked for Tricare Medical Healthcare system.

In 2007 Pepper learned to wire wrap and bead from Marie Banta. In 2008 Sam started making cabochons, Pepper would wire wrap those stones and hey started selling her work at shows. They joined the Southwest Gem and Mineral Society and the San Antonio Geological Society and enjoyed participating in field trips. In 2009 Claude Townsend suggested Sam and Mary join the Fredericksburg Rockhounds.

Sam enjoys rock hounding very much. Many clubs saw his success and asked him to be their field trip coordinator. Sam currently finds himself as the field trip coordinator for Midland, Alpine, Victoria, Austin, Fredericksburg, San Antonio Geological Society, San Antonio Rock and Mineral Society, Tri Cities, Fort Worth Gem and Mineral, Abilene and Dallas Gem and Mineral. Sam primarily leads rock hunts to the Eagle Pass area with one group being 82 cars and 122 people.

Sam tells a story of how he was collecting at the "old pit" in Eagle Pass and saw a border patrol man going North. Sam chased him down and the border patrol man stopped because he was being chased. Sam asked him if there was any other place to find rock along the Rio Grande and as a result of the chase a new pit (where many of us rockhounds now collect) was found.

Sam's other hobbies include stamp collecting, embroidery, wood carving, leather work, cake decorating and baking.

Sam has no intention of retiring, he is having too much fun!



#### **December's Birthstone & Flowers**

The December birthstone is the **turquoise**; the flower are the **narcissus** and the **holly**.



Turquoise is found most often in very dry areas where volcanic activity has occurred. Unlike many other gems, turquoise is opaque rather than translucent. Its blue-green color can vary from sky blue or greenish blue to pale green or greenish gray. Bluer stones are considered more valuable and contain more copper.

The holly symbolizes your wish for domestic happiness. Although some animals and birds enjoy holly berries, they are toxic to humans.

The narcissus conveys that you want your beloved to stay just the way they are. While there are many types of narcissus, the paperwhite is the winter-growing variety and the birth flower for December.

The club will no longer mail out hard copies of the newsletter to members. Those who have provided the club with an email address will continue to receive notifications via email when the newsletter is published for viewing online.




