## **Alien Minerals?**

A unique meteorite named "Hypatia," found in 1996 in western Egypt by the Egyptian Geological Survey, may be older than our solar system, and is unlike any other known meteorite. The minerals it contains are distinct from anything discovered in the solar system, and seem to have formed prior to the sun and planets, perhaps in another solar system entirely.

Although the major elements are the same — carbon, silicon, aluminum and iron— the ratios are all wrong. Unlike the composition of objects that orbit our sun, it has a massive amount of carbon and an unusually small amount of silicon. Minerals found in the meteorite include pure native

aluminum, grains of silver iodine phosphide, moissanite (silicon carbide), and a surface druse of microscopic diamonds. There are also grains of a compound consisting of mainly nickel and phosphorus, with very little iron, a mineral composition never observed before on Earth, the moon, or in meteorites. Furthermore, there are no silicate minerals at all.

Hypatia is in a class by itself.

Also, you're missing **important announcements**, such as field trip updates, event date changes, new training classes, and other late-arriving




