Bill Wildfong

- A Biography -

Bill was born in St. Louis in 1936. He lived there until he was in his teens. His father, William, was a pharmaceutical salesman and a registered pharmacist. His mother, Vivian Niederloh, was a stay-at-home mom. Bill has a sister, Sharon, who now lives in Peoria. The Wildfong family moved from St. Louis to Hannibal, Missouri, Burlington, Iowa and then to Peoria, Illinois. Bill moved to Fort Myer, Florida, Orlando, Florida and to Kerrville in 1999.

Bill attended Malinkrodt Grade School and Southwest High School in St. Louis. He then attended High School in Hannibal, Missouri and graduated from High School at Burlington High School in Iowa. Wildfong studied Electrical Engineering at Bradley University in Peoria and the University of Illinois in Champaign/Urbana, with no diploma.

Bill's first real job was as an Electronics Technician for Illinois Bell Telephone in Peoria. He then took a job as equipment engineer for Florida Telephone (now Embarq) in Ft Myers, Florida. Bill joined the Naval Reserve and taught electronics at the monthly Navy Reserve meetings.

Bill and Cheryl met at a skin-diving club meeting in Florida, and it was love at first sight. They married in 1972. Cheryl has a nursing degree (LPN); she worked in an ear-nose-throat clinic under Dr. Robin Brown, the author of "Florida's Fossils" and "Florida's First People." Bill took early retirement with a "golden parachute" in 1997. Cheryl also retired. They were already avid fossil hunters and after retirement they traveled to the Southwest, where they discovered gems and minerals. Bill and Cheryl visited Jim and Jackie Chude's rock shop and fell in love with Fredericksburg. They decided to move from Orlando to Kerrville in 1999. Cheryl loves gardening and Bill is a computer addict, with no interest in computer games.

Bill published a newsletter for the Succulents Club in Kerrville and he and Cheryl were active members of that club. Bill and Cheryl have a greenhouse and have raised succulents for years. Cheryl has a loom and is an avid weaver.

Bill and Cheryl joined the Fredericksburg Rockhounds in 2001 and volunteered to publish the newsletter. Bill published the award-winning newsletter and also maintained the Rockhounds membership lists until December 2017. Cheryl is an excellent graphics person and has also put a lot of work into the Rockhounds newsletters. In their early years with the Rockhounds, Bill and Cheryl were vendors at the annual Rock and Mineral show. Bill and Cheryl have been granted lifetime memberships with the Fredericksburg Rockhounds.



February Birthstone & Flowers

The February birthstone is the **amethyst**; the flowers are the **violet** and the **primrose**.



The February birthstone, the amethyst, is said to strengthen relationships and give its wearer courage. Amethysts are a type of quartz often found in geodes amidst cooled lava. Their purple coloring runs the gamut from reddish purple to a bluish lilac. The finest quality is a strongly saturated reddish purple to dark purple as long as the stone does not become too dark to see its brightness.

The February birth month flowers are the violet and the primrose.

Violets signify watchfulness, loyalty, and faithfulness.

The other February birth flower is the primrose, which lets someone know you can't live without them.

The club will no longer mail out hard copies of the newsletter to members. Those who have provided the club with an email address will continue to receive notifications via email when the newsletter is published for viewing online.


