- A Biography -

I was born and raised in Cleveland, Ohio. As a kid, I spent all my waking time exploring the Metropolitan Park which was adjacent to our home. I played a lot of baseball and I ran track and did gymnastics in high school. After high school, I attended Ohio State University for two years, after which time I transferred to Case Western Reserve where I received a B.A. in Geology and an M.S. in Geology with honors.

I was hired by Amoco (now British Petroleum) in 1969 and moved to Houston where I spent my entire professional career. After Amoco, I worked for a few independent oil companies. In 1979, I and three other ex-Amoco geologists formed Geo-Consultants, Inc., a small independent oil company. I became President of GCI and we operated for over ten years, drilling wells in Texas and Louisiana. My final position was Onshore Exploration Manager for Amerada Hess Corporation. I early retired in 2000.

I have been a 35-year member of the American Association of Petroleum Geologists, and I'm a certified professional geologist by the American Society of Professional Geologists.

I joined Fredericksburg Rockhounds in 2004, and I have served as Education Chair, Treasurer, President, and for the past six years I've been the Show Chairman. I have held some position for all fourteen years as a club member. I have given geological talks to schools, clubs, libraries throughout the Texas Hill Country, and I offered a class in "Hill Country Geology" for the Fredericksburg Continuing Education program. After working as a substitute teacher, I became involved with the Mentoring Program where I have followed two young men throughout their elementary, middle school and into their high school years. I have been mentoring for twelve years.

In addition to geology, my hobbies are collecting Native American artifacts, hiking, restoring furniture and golfing.

Dinosaur Footprints Discovered on Isle of Skye

Dinosaur footprints dating back 170 million years have been discovered on a Scottish island and will help shed light on the reptiles' evolution, the University of Edinburgh said on Tuesday.

The footprints are in a muddy, shallow lagoon on the Isle of Skye.

The largest print, left by a sauropod, measures 70 centimeters (28 inches) across. Long-necked sauropods were up to two meters tall.

"The find is globally important as it is rare evidence of the Middle Jurassic period, from which few fossil sites have been found around the world," the university said in a statement.

Researchers are documenting about 50 footprints in the area, including those of theropods — an ancestor of Tyrannosaurus Rex — which measure around 50 centimeters across.



They used drone photographs to make a map of the site.

Paige dePolo, who led the study, said the find "demonstrates the presence of sauropods in this part of the world thro longer timescale than previously known".

The research was carried out in conjunction with the Chinese Academy of Sciences and the findings have been published in the Scottish Journal of Geology.

July's Birthstone & Flowers

The July birthstone is the **ruby**; the flowers are the **larkspur** and the **water lily**.



In ancient times, the ruby was regarded as the "king of gems" by the Hindus. All rubies are red and come in various shades of the hue. Ruby comes from the Latin word *rubeus*, which means "red."

The ruby is among the hardest natural gemstones, second only to the diamond.

The larkspur can grow up to eight feet tall and comes in a variety of colors such as pink, white, or purple.

Water lilies float on the surface of natural waters such as ponds. They help deter algae growth and provide shade for wildlife below.

The club will no longer mail out hard copies of the newsletter to members. Those who have provided the club with an email address will continue to receive notifications via email when the newsletter is published for viewing online.




