## October Birthstone & Flowers

The October birthstone is the opal; the flowers are the marigold and the cosmos.

The word opal is rooted in both Latin (opalus — "precious jewel") and Greek (opallios — "to see a change in color"). The term opallios is an apt description as opals tend to reflect a vast array of colors depending on the source of light.

Marigolds are symbols of contentment and warmth. They can grow anywhere from six inches in height to over five feet depending on the variety.

Cosmos, the other October flower, stands for order, peace, and serenity. They are annuals that are a good choice for your garden if you want to attract birds, bees, and butterflies.

## FREDERICKSBURG ROCKHOUNDS MEETING MINUTES

September 5, 2022

Frank Rowell called the meeting to order at 7:02 p.m. Five new members were announced: Diana and Bruce Watts of San Antonio and Marcos Mar of Fredericksburg whose wife Kantika and son Lucas (also members) were not at the meeting.

Karen Anderson introduced the program, a video from Dan Hurd about jade hunting and identification. Mr. Hurd pointed out that jade comes in a variety of colors and said that nephrite and jade are the same thing. He was shown digging different sizes of specimens close to the Frazier River in British Columbia, Canada. Testing the rocks to see if they were jade included using a flashlight to see if light passed through a slice of the rock. (Jade would let the light pass through.) Another test was using a scribe to determine the hardness of the sample. Jade, which has a hardness of 6, would not be scratched by the metal point of the scribe. Serpentine, which has a hardness of 3 would be scratched.

September 5, 2022

Mr. Hurd pointed out that what sometimes looks like a scratch on jade is actually residue from the metal point of the scribe. Testing for the specific gravity of jade, which is 3, was demonstrated. After a break for refreshments, Lynn Post brought a picture rock to award to the person present who had been a member of the Fredericksburg Rockhounds for the longest period of time. Yvonne Starr, whose membership goes back to the 1990's, was the recipient of this wonderful gift.

Frank Rowell said that we would have a silent auction at our show in January and that most of the regular dealers would be back. He presented the idea of selling Fredericksburg Rockhound t-shirts at the show. Frank pointed out the need for a nominating committee for Vice President and Treasurer, whose terms would be expiring in January. No one volunteered, but Steve Perez and Jim Gedeon said they would serve another term in these positions if necessary. Lee Adams promptly responded that we would be on the nominating committee!

Virginia Adian announced that the South Central and American Federations will have a joint meeting in New Orleans and proposed that our organization pay for gas, hotel, and fees for two of our members to attend this convention.


