November will be my last program for 2022. I will continue with one more year of programs in 2023, which will be my 5th year!!!! How time flies when you're having fun!!!

This would be every rockhound's dream field trip, however, you would only have a few minutes to live!!!!!

I announced my November program at October's meeting and asked how many members knew of this place. Only Frank Rowell did!!! So, this should be a very exciting program!

What is it, you ask? The place is in Naica, Chihuahua, Mexico, and it is the Giant Crystal Cave. Some of the giant crystals are 36 ft long by 13 ft in diameter and can weigh up to 55 tons!!! The cave is located over an intrusion of magma which causes the temperature to be a sweltering 136 degrees with 99% humidity.

Only scientists with special permits are granted access to the cave to explore as they have to wear special cooling suits. They can only explore for about 15 minutes and then they have to leave the cave.

Plans are being considered to build a replica cave which would be safe for people to explore the gigantic crystals. Sign me up!!!!

Jade and Nephrite jade

What is the difference? In our last newsletter there was an article in which Mr. Hurd said that "Nephrite jade and Jade are the same thing". Nothing could be further from the truth. The word jade is associated with the mineral Jadeite which is a valid species while Nephrite jade is the mineral Actinolite, also a valid species. They are both used for carving and jewelry manufacturing and look similar which results in people thinking that are both the same mineral. Jadeite is the rarer of the two and is more transparent. Jadeite can be very beautiful and expensive. Do you want to learn more? If so, look up some information on these two exceptional minerals.

#### November Birthstone & Flower

The November birthstone is the **topaz**; the flower is the **chrysanthemum**.







Chrysanthemum

Topaz is the mineral fluoro-hydroxy silicate and is the hardest of all known silicate minerals. Topaz itself is colorless but impurities within can turn it into almost any color. Yellow or amber is most often associated with topaz. Interestingly, even though blue topaz is rare to find naturally (most for sale have been treated to get the color) it is Imperial topaz (reddish orange with pink undertones) that is the most valuable.

The lone flower for the month of November is the chrysanthemum. It is a perennial and comes in a variety of colors. After they finish blooming in autumn, they can be mulched with straw to protect them from inclement weather.


