


PREZ SAYS

The Fredericksburg Rockhounds has its origin as the Llano Uplift Rock Club. In 1968 a decision was made to move the club to Fredericksburg. Several members formed the Highland Lakes Gem & Mineral Society in Marble Falls. (no longer active). The club was reorganized on July 15th 1968 as the Fredericksburg Rockhounds with 65 members. The club constitution was adopted by the Exective Counsil on October 22nd 1968, and by the general membership on March 3rd 1969. At first the club met and held their Gem & Mineral Show at the American Legion Hall, however the large crowds severely strained the facility. The gem show was moved to the pavilion at Lady Bird Municipal Park in the mid 1970s. Several club members were asked to submit recommendations for the design of the facility. Popular features of the show include vendors, demonstrations and exibits put on by club members. The club now meets at the Golden Hub Senior Center. There has been an almost complete turnover of the membership since the founding in 1968. Members now hail from a much wider area and their interests are often quite different. However one thing has not changed, members enjoy each others company, and talk about rocks and interesting programs They also love to eat. Come join the fun at our meetings.

We are affiliated with the American Federation of Mineral Societies (AFMS) and the South Central Federation of Mineral Societies (SCFMS)

We hold our meetings at 7:00pm on the first Monday of the month at the Golden Hub Senior Center, 1009 N. Lincoln, Fredericksburg Texas (excpt in June, when we have our annual picnic).

January Birthstone & Flower

The January birthstone is the **garnet**; the flowers are the **carnation** and **snowdrop**.

The garnet, is thought to keep the wearer safe during travel. Garnets form in layers of rock deep underground where they withstand extreme temperature variations. Geologists study garnets to understand the effects of temperature and pressure on surrounding rocks. Although the garnet is commonly associated with a range of red hues, it also sometimes forms in other colors, including greens, yellows, and even blues.

The carnation comes in several different colors, which convey different meanings, much like roses. A pink carnation means affection, while a red carnation means 'I love you.'

The snowdrop used to be considered bad luck because it always seemed to grow in graveyards, but nowadays, this delicate flower signifies hope and beauty.

November 7, 2022

Frank Roswell called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm. After Frank told some rockhound jokes, new members Ed, Melissa, and Eddy Keilmann were recognized. Guests Susie Fisher, Patrick Jones, and Dan Moreno's friend Whitney also attended this meeting. We were informed of the passing of long-time member Claudette Hollis. Karen Anderson reported that active member Sam Rodgers had suffered a heart attack.

The program was a fascinating video of the Giant Crystal Cave, which sits above an intrusion of magma 984 feet below the surface of the Sierra de Naica Mountain in Chihuahua, Mexico. Gigantic crystals in the cave have grown as large as 35 feet by 13 feet and weigh as much as 55 tons. The molten rock below the heats the air inside the cave to 113 degrees. The humidity in the cave is more than 90%. Going inside the cave without special cooling suits could be fatal within 15 minutes.

The rough terrain and sharp points on the crystals present additional dangers. It took explorer George Kourounis two years to get permission to make his trip inside the cave. In 2009 he filmed the video. We got an account of the extensive preparations for entering the cave and got to see the fantastically large crystals inside. It was almost like a science fiction movie.

Jim Gedeon gave the Treasurer's report. Frank Roswell showed us a sample of the rack cards advertising the show in January. The show will feature a silent auction. Frank reported

that a couple of spaces on the stage and some outdoor spaces were available.

There will be no program in December. We will bring food and socialize.

The January meeting will be devoted to the show.


