August Birthstone & Flowers

The August birthstone is the **peridot**; the flowers are the **gladiolus** and the **poppy**.

The peridot is a symbol of strength. It is light green in color and as such is sometimes called the evening emerald. It can be found in the volcanic lava of Hawaii as well as in meteorites.

The largest peridot found to date weighs in at 319 carats and is on display in the Smithsonian Institution in Washington, DC.

The gladiolus, also known as the sword lily, stands for remembrance and calm.

Poppies come in different colors and have various meanings. Red poppies are for pleasure; white for consolation; and yellow for wishes of wealth and success.

FREDERICKSBURG ROCKHOUNDS MEETING MINUTES

July 3, 2023

Frank Rowell to order at 7:00 pm. Frank told some pretty good jokes.

Guests Connie Davis and Jackie Chude's mother, Georgia Matusek, were recognized. Karen Anderson introduced the program, a video about the Faberge eggs commissioned by Alexander III and Nicholas II, the last two emperors of the Romanov dynasty in Russia. Alexander III had Peter Carl Faberge, a goldsmith and jewelry business owner in St. Petersberg, design the first imperial Easter egg as a surprise for his wife in 1885. Known as the Hen Egg, it has a 2.5 inch ceramic shell with a gold band around the middle. Inside is a gold "yolk" that opens to reveal a golden hen sitting on golden straw. The emperor's wife was so delighted that he commissioned Faberge to craft an imperial Easter egg every year. Apparently Faberge was given freedom to design these eggs, and they became more elaborate over time. It took Faberge and his employees a year, sometimes two, to create an egg. After Alexander III's death in 1894, his son, Nicholas II, continued the tradition every year until 1916, with the exception of 1904 and 1905 during the Russo-Japanese War.

He presented both his mother and his wife with imperial Easter eggs until 1916. He and his family were executed by the Communists. Seven of the 50 eggs have not been found. The eggs were taken to the Kremlin, and many were sold to raise money for the Communists.

Frank Roswell reported that no field trips will be held until we get cooler weather. Melissa Keilman volunteered to oversee the refreshment supplies and activities.


