MARCH 2024

Who's excited to go hunt for some one-of-a-kind, gorgeous, West Texas agates? I know I am! Aaron Thomas (our guide) and James Winn VI (owner) have devoted an entire weekend, 6-7 April, at the Kokernot 06 Ranch just for us! The total cost to dig for both days is \$120 with an additional charge of \$2 per pound. I can tell you from experience that you'll get way more than your money's worth (see photos) with the agates you'll find. Aaron is also very attentive to you while you're hunting, so if you're not finding anything he'll ensure that you take some good ones home with you. If we have 15 or more members attend then the price goes down to \$50 per day to dig. Steve Perez will handle getting / driving a 9-pack passenger van that the club will pay for to help get club members there and back. We will discuss departure location, date and time at the March meeting.

Other things to know for the trip:

- The Kokernot 06 Ranch is located 10 miles north of Alpine, so that will be your best bet for accommodations. There are several hotels in Alpine.
- We'll meet up with Aaron at 8am both mornings at the Tri-La-Bite Food Truck parking lot located at 605 East Holland Drive in Alpine. We'll typically end each day by 6pm.

- If you're not in the passenger van then ensure that your vehicle has at least 7" of clearance. 4x4 is preferable. RV's and motorhomes are not allowed on the ranch's roads.

You should bring: rock pick(s), collecting buckets, backpack, good boots or hiking shoes, gloves, digging tools, sunscreen and/or sun hat, food and water (better to bring a cooler full versus running out by noon) for the day, a first aid kit is recommended, and a full tank of gas.

- The weather there can go from hot and windy to cold and raining, so check the local weather before we depart and pack accordingly.
- The terrain is desert with mountainous and hilly ecosystems. It's an arid climate and includes ravines, cobbles, flat grass, scrub brush with thorns (recommend wearing pants), and canyons.

We will discuss all of this in detail at the March meeting, but please feel free to reach out to me with any questions you have before or after that. I look forward to the memories we'll make on this trip and hope you can join us.

The March birthstone is the **aquamarine**; the flower is the **daffodil**, also known as the jonquil.

The March birthstone, aquamarine, was thought to cure heart, liver, and stomach diseases—all one had to do was drink the water in which the gem had been soaking. Early sailors believed that aquamarine talismans, etched with the likeness of the sea god Neptune, protected them against ocean dangers.

The March birth month flower is the daffodil, one of the first flowers of spring brings us new beginnings and, as the poet Keats said, daffodils bring "joy for ever". With their bright yellow petals, daffodils seem the perfect way to say that the sun is always shining whenever your loved one is around.


