Greetings and salutations fellow Rockhounds! I hope you've all enjoyed the fairly mild summer here in central Texas. However, I'm sure we're all excited for even cooler Fall weather to arrive!

Speaking of which, our Fall club Arkansas crystal dig will be 10-13 October. We currently have five members going and we'd love to have you come too! We'll leave (time / location tbd) on Friday, 10 Oct, and arrive early evening in Hot Springs, Arkansas. We'll dig at Wegner Mine on Saturday, 11 Oct, and Ron Coleman Mine on Sunday, 12 Oct. Wegner Mine will cost \$19 for 2 hours; \$38 for 4 hours; or \$57 for 6 hours. Depends on how long y'all want to dig. Ron Coleman Mine is only \$25 per day for adults; \$20 per day for seniors; \$5 per day for children (7-15); and children under 6 are free! We'll drive back home on Monday, 13 Oct.

We'll need to bring our own tools, buckets, etc. Highly recommend a rock hammer, long flathead screwdriver, trowel, and small shovel. Bring digging clothes that you don't mind getting stained with orange mud. Sunscreen, hat, bug spray, plenty of water, and snacks are highly recommended too.

The club can rent a 9-pack van or equivalent type vehicle if enough people want to go. I'm willing to drive. Club members will need to procure their own lodging. I typically stay at the Holiday Inn Express and Suites Hot Springs.

They tend to have the lowest rates and serve a hot breakfast. Regardless of where you stay in Hot Springs, we'll pick you up / drop you off at that location if

you don't bring your own vehicle.

September Birthstone & Flowers

The September birthstone is the **sapphire**; the flowers are the **aster** and the **morning glory**.







Saphire Aster Morning Glory

Sapphires are a form of corundum and generally come in many shades of blue that run the gamut from light to dark. Sapphire was once believed to ward off evil and protect against poison.

Asters bloom in the late summer and early autumn and need little care to flourish. They are symbolic of powerful love.

A symbol of affection, morning glories live up to their name: they open their blooms in the early part of their day and then close them later in the afternoon.


